# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SHAWBURY PARISH COUNCIL HELD ONLINE ON TUESDAY 13<sup>th</sup>. OCTOBER 2020 at 7.00pm.

#### 20/74 Apologies:

Apologies had been received from Councillors Mr. R. Pinches and Ms. S. McIntosh and Inspector C. Greenaway (W. Mercia Police).

## 20/75 Personal or Prejudicial Interests.

There were no interests declared.

## 20/76 Minutes of Meeting held on September 8th. 2020

The minutes of the meeting having been circulated, were approved and at an appropriate time would be signed by the Chairman as a true record.

#### 20/77 Matters Arising.

#### (a) School Road Safety Project (20/62(c)).

It was noted that thanks to the efforts of Shropshire Councillor S. Jones, work on the project was now being undertaken.

## (b) Road sign repairs (20/47(e)).

Councillor P. Sharp reminded Members that they had been emailed a photograph of the design for the new signs and the one for Cedar Avenue would be erected within the next few days. Providing it was acceptable the remaining signs would be ordered from the same company and Members agreed that it would be preferable to replace some signs rather than carrying out extensive and difficult repairs.

#### (c) Highways (20/62(e)).

It was noted that repairs had been carried out to the drains on the A53 at Edgebolton and that the 40mph repeater sign at that location had been moved to a new site. Other than those items there was no action on all the other issues which had been reported.

#### (d) Traffic Light Problem (20/62(f)).

After considerable delay and many received complaints the problem with the lights appeared to have been resolved.

#### (e) Annual Parish Meeting (20/62(g).

It was agreed that, as a result of the on-going restrictions planned to last until next March, it would not be possible to hold a meeting this year. Clerk would prepare a public notice for the Newsletter, Notice Boards and the Web site.

#### (f) Public Consultation re CIL.

It was agreed to publicise details of the grant and seek suggestions from residents for projects worthy of support, stating that the following had already been proposed – Up-grading the Children's Play Areas at both sites; replacing concrete streetlights and installing Led units and providing a grant towards the development of the sports facilities behind the Farm Shop.

# (g) Streetlight up-grades. (20/67(a)).

Quotations for the replacement of the concrete streetlights and the installation of Led units in Bridgeway and Millbrook Drive were approved at a total cost of £14,421.00 (+VAT). The Clerk would be notifying the residents of the planned work before the project got underway.

### (h) Playing field - path repair (20/67(a)

Clerk reported that Mr. Paul Butter (Shropshire Council) had agreed to provide a quotation for the work. (i)Play Area repairs (20/67(b).

Following receipt of the annual safety inspection, Councillor P. Sharp reported that he had met with Mr. Ray Parry to assess the work needed to carry out necessary repairs to both play area sites. Details of these with the quotations would be forwarded to Members to consider and a decision on how to proceed would be made at the November meeting. The overall cost was likely to be over £20,000.

Clerk reported that there had been no response to the adverts for a new Member

#### (a)Access to the Allotment:

It was noted that changes had been made by the Housing Association which prevented easy vehicle access to the allotment and made it difficult to park a car close to the site. It was suggested that an alternative access could be created and the Clerk agreed to discuss this with the Housing Association, providing he was supplied with a draft drawing of the suggested changes.

## Lt. Matthew Peters reported that:

- 1. The charity motor cycle event had been very successful and thanks were extended to all those who had been involved.
- 2. Gliding activity was planned to start on October 25<sup>th</sup>. and would only take place on one day at the weekends.
- 3. Night Flying would be taking place between October 19<sup>th</sup>. and November 14<sup>th</sup>.
- 4. The new Commanding Officer Group Captain Phil Watney would be taking over the base on December 11<sup>th</sup>.

## (c) Shropshire Council.

Shropshire Councillor S. Jones apologised for not attending the early part of the meeting - he had been Chairing the Helicopter Noise Liaison Committee. He went on to state that:

- 1. Shropshire Council were involved in serious talks about electrifying the rail link between Shrewsbury and Wolverhampton.
- 2. He had taken serious action over the delay with the school project which seemed to have worked.
- 3. He had reported the problems on Wem Road following the removal of the speed humps and would continue to chase the Highways Department to take the necessary action to improve the whole road. In response to a question from Councillor A. Brown he reported that he had not had any response about the A53 roundabout.
